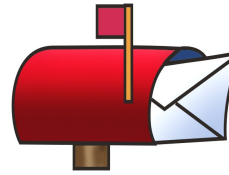

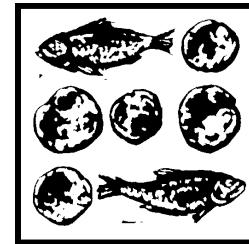

FROM THE  
*PASTOR'S DESK*

The best laid plans, part 2....

Last week, we saw Jesus' plans to have his disciples go off for some quiet time together – only to be foiled by the appearance of a crowd in need of Jesus' ministry. This week (along with a shift from Mark's Gospel to that of John) we see Jesus feeding the crowds. While the shift from one Gospel tradition to another is deliberate on the part of the editors of our Lectionary, the flow is also deliberate: Last week the Gospel depicted a Liturgy of the Word, this week a Liturgy of the Eucharist.



Speaking of the shift to John's Gospel, it is interesting to note that in John's account of the Last Supper, John glosses over the meal: He concentrates on the Washing of the Feet. A common theory among Johannine Scripture scholars is that John saw the establishment of the Eucharist in the earlier feedings of the crowds by Jesus.

In these summer weeks, let us join the crowds and allow ourselves to be fed by Jesus – and let us pick up a few encounters with the Word sent by God in the process! Beach reading, anyone?

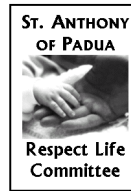

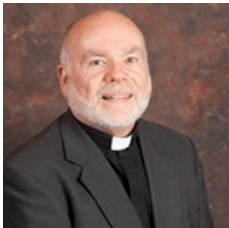
## Save the Date!
