Celebrate Mass at the Shrine of the Miraculous Medal, where our Blessed Mother appeared to St. Catherine Labouré, tour the beautiful Sacré Coeur Basilica, and enjoy a dinner cruise on the Seine River, passing the illuminated monuments of Paris.

We'll continue to Chartres to visit Our Lady of Chartres Cathedral, which has been a major pilgrimage site for centuries, depicting more than five thousand images in its sculpture works and stained-glass windows. Visit Paray-Le-Monial, where Our Lord appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the Visitation Convent, and celebrate Mass in the Basilica of the Visitation in Annecy. Continuing on to Italy, we will enjoy beautiful Venice with its famed canals, and Bologna, the gastronomic capital of Italy. In Assisi, we'll walk in the footsteps of St. Francis and St. Clare and pray at the tomb of the newly sainted Carlo Acutis.

Our pilgrimage concludes in Rome, the "Eternal City." Tour the pilgrim basilicas of Rome, marvel at the works of art in the Vatican Museums and Sistine Chapel, and celebrate Mass in St. Peter's Basilica. ## DAY 1 Monday, July 13: Depart USA

Depart Philadelphia International Airport for our overseas journey to Paris, France. Complimentary meals and beverage will be served on board. (D)

## DAY 2 Tuesday, July 14: Arrive in Paris | Orientation Tour

Arrive at Paris Charles de Gaulle International Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet a Peter's Way Tours tour manager as we exit from Customs. Board our comfortable motor coach and we will be on our way to Paris, the "City of Light." Our guide will bring to life the sights of this magnificent city on the River Seine: the Eiffel Tower, Champs Elysées, Arc de Triomphe, Tomb of Napoleon, Place de la Concorde, the Opéra, Bastille Square, and the Place des Vosges. Independent lunch. Check-in at our hotel in Paris. **Celebrate Mass before dinner.** Welcome dinner and overnight at our hotel in Paris. (B,D)

## DAY 3 Wednesday, July 15: Pilgrim Churches of Paris | Seine River Cruise

Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day at Rue de Bac with a visit to the Shrine of the Miraculous Medal. **Celebrate Mass in the Chapel of the Miraculous Medal**, where our Blessed Mother appeared to St. Catherine Labouré in 1830. Continue to the nearby Shrine of St. Vincent DePaul, where his saintly remains are preserved and venerated. Next, we will go to Ile de la Cité and visit the magnificent cathedral Notre Dame de Paris, a jewel of gothic art that houses the Crown of Thorns. Its massive flying buttresses, famous towers, and elegant rose windows will take your breath away. At the nearby Sainte Chapelle, discover the famous stained-glass windows rendering the air iridescent with light and color, symbols of the heavenly Jerusalem. Independent lunch. Visit Montmartre, with its fascinating Artists Square and Sacré Coeur Basilica. Dinner at a restaurant in Paris. **After dinner, enjoy a special cruise on the Seine** and see history spanning 1,000 years while passing 25 bridges and illuminated monuments of Paris. Overnight at our hotel in Paris. (B,D)

## DAY 4 Thursday, July 16: Chartres | Paray-Le-Monial

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we will leave Paris for Chartres. The cathedral spires of Chartres can be seen from miles away, seeming to rise out of the wheat fields of the Beauce Plains. In Chartres, we will visit Notre Dame Cathedral, which boasts an unrivaled expanse of sculpture as well as one of Europe's most impressive collections of stained-glass windows. The cathedral of Chartres also houses the Sancta Camisia, a tunic that tradition says belonged to the Blessed Virgin Mary. **Celebrate Mass in the Crypt at Notre Dame Cathedral in Chartres.** After Mass, we will continue to Paray-le-Monial. En route, we will stop at one of the local châteaux for an independent wine tasting and light lunch. Late afternoon, we'll arrive in Paray-Le-Monial. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Paray-Le-Monial. (B,D)

## DAY 5 Friday, July 17: Paray-Le-Monial | Annecy

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we will visit Paray-Le-Monial, where Our Lord appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the Visitation Convent. From here, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus spread throughout the world. Visit the great medieval church, built as the official basilica to commemorate the apparition. Time will be given for prayer and reflection at the Shrine in Paray-Le-Monial. After our visit, continue to Thorens. Independent lunch. We'll visit Thorens, where St Francis de Sales was born. Visit the Château de Sales, home of the Sales family, and the chapel built on the location of the room where St. Francis was born. See the cross where it is believed that St. Francis de Sales was inspired by God to create the Order of the Visitation. We will also visit the parish church where he was baptized and consecrated Bishop of Geneva. Continue to the village of Annecy, magnificently situated on Lake Annecy, also known as the Blue Lake, in the heart of the Savoy Alps. St. Francis de Sales and St. Jane Frances de Chantal founded the Congregation of the Visitation in Annecy in 1610. **Celebrate Mass in the Basilica of the Visitation.** Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Annecy. (B,D)

## DAY 6 Saturday, July 18: Geneva | Padua

Breakfast at our hotel. For those who wish, another visit to the Basilica of the Visitation will be made possible. This morning, we'll be transferred to Geneva Airport for our short flight to Venice, Italy. Upon arrival at Venice Airport, claim our luggage, meet our bus and driver, and soon we'll be on our way to the lovely town of Padua. Independent lunch upon arrival. This afternoon, we'll visit the Basilica of St. Anthony, with its famous Chapel of the Relics containing the actual tongue and lower jawbone of the saint. The basilica also contains a mixture of Gothic, Romanesque, and Byzantine architecture, holding a huge collection of art treasures. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Anthony.** Check-in at our hotel. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Mestre. (B,D)

## DAY 7 Sunday, July 19: Highlight Tour of Venice | Free Afternoon

Breakfast at our hotel. Today, we will be transferred to the pier for a boat transfer to St. Mark's Square to explore this lovely and famous lagoon city on the Adriatic Coast. **Celebrate Mass at St. Mark's Basilica.** After Mass, begin our day with a walking tour of Venice's hub of activity, Piazza San Marco, which is lined with galleries, luxury shops, and charming cafes. Dominating the square is the magnificent Basilica San Marco, where the mixture of styles—Byzantine, Romanesque, and Gothic—and profuse decoration reflect Venice's history. Marvel at the shimmering mosaics encrusted on its interior walls, the precious sculptures, and rare marbles. Admire the Campanile, having simple lines contrasting sharply with the sumptuous decor of the church and clock tower, where famous Moors have been striking the hours for over 500 years. Continue to the Bridge of Sighs,

which connects to the Doge's Palace and the Piombi Prisons. The bridge is so named because of the sad laments of the prisoners as they were led across it. Independent lunch. Free afternoon to explore Venice on your own. Don't miss out on an optional gondola trip, gliding along the picturesque canals with a local troubadour. Independent dinner. Overnight at our hotel in Mestre. (B)

## DAY 8 Monday, July 20: Bologna | Assisi

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave for Assisi. En route we'll visit Bologna, the gastronomic capital of Italy. Throughout its long history, first as an Etruscan city, then a Roman one, then an independent city-state in the Middle Ages, Bologna has always been a power in the north of Italy. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Dominic** and visit the tomb of the founder of the Dominican Order of Preachers. See Nettuno Square, with its elaborate Baroque fountain. After our visit, we'll continue to Assisi. A stop will be made for wine tasting and snacks.

This afternoon, arrive in Assisi. As we approach you will see Assisi on a mountain top, with its narrow lanes, shrines of Saint Francis, and vast collection of art dedicated to the young friar, a rich young man who turned to God after an illness and established an order that has grown stronger over the centuries. Visit the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli, built in 1569 and crowned by Alessi's magnificent dome. The basilica enclosed the shrine of the "Porziuncula," or the Little Portion Chapel, around which the first Franciscan community was centered. This is the place where Saint Clare, the first (and most important) heroine of the Franciscan movement, received the habit from Francis. We will also see the Capella Del Transito, which marks the spot where Francis died. In the courtyard, thornless roses bloom near a statue of the saint. Check-in at our hotel. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Assisi. (B,D)

## DAY 9 Tuesday, July 21: Assisi | Rome

Breakfast at our hotel. **Begin our day with Mass at the Tomb of St. Francis.** After Mass, our local guide will take us to explore the basilica complex, which is composed of two churches built one atop the other. Beneath both churches is the crypt that houses the tomb of St. Francis. The lower basilica dates from 1228 to 1230 and is richly decorated with beautiful stained-glass windows and paintings by some of the most important artists of the 13th and 14th centuries. In the upper basilica, built from 1230 to 1253, we will marvel at the monumental frescoes painted by Giotto, which depict scenes from the life of the saint. Continue to the Basilica of St. Clare to view her remains and see the miraculous Crucifix. Independent lunch. Free time to visit Piazza del Comune, Chiesa Nuova, the home and clothworkshops of Pietro Bernadone and Lady Pica (St. Francis' parents), the home of St. Clare's parents, the Bishop's Palace, or the Sanctuary of the Renunciation, a part of the Church of St. Mary Major. The Shrine of Saint Carlo Acutis is in a sanctuary located on the spot where a young St. Francis of Assisi is said to have cast off his rich clothes in favor of a poor habit. Pray near the tomb of Saint Carlo Acutis, who had a passionate devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Late afternoon, continue to Rome. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

## DAY 10 Wednesday, July 22: Papal Audience | Pilgrim Churches of Rome

After an early breakfast, **enter the heart of Christendom for an audience with our Holy Father (subject to confirmation). Pope Leo XIV will greet the pilgrims, deliver his message, pray the Pater Noster, and bless religious articles.** Our pilgrimage group will be acknowledged during the English language portion. Independent lunch. This afternoon we will visit the pilgrim basilicas of Rome. Begin with a visit to the Basilica of St. Mary Major, built by Pope Sixtus III (AD 432-440). The crypt includes a statue of Pope Pius IX and a stunning reliquary that contains pieces of ancient wood, which tradition holds to be part of the manger where the Infant Jesus was laid, brought by pilgrims from the Holy Land. In the Borghese Chapel, view the icon *Salus Populi Romani* ("Protectress of the Roman People"), believed to have been painted by St. Luke. The mosaics above the entablature are among the most ancient Christian mosaics in Rome. Next, visit the Cathedral of St. John Lateran, founded by Emperor Constantine in the 4th century, home to the popes for many years prior to the present Vatican residence, and the first Christian church to be consecrated. From there we will pass by the Holy Stairs, said to be the steps on which Christ walked on His way to Pilate's palace. You can go up on your knees as thousands of pilgrims have done in reverently recalling the sufferings of Christ. Next, visit the Basilica of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem, which houses fragments of the true cross brought to Rome by St. Helena, mother of Constantine. End our day at the Minor Basilica of Saint Lawrence Outside-the-Walls, one of the Seven Pilgrim Churches and one of Rome's oldest churches, housing relics of St. Lawrence, St. Justin, St. Stephen, and the Tomb of St. Pius IX. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Lawrence.** Independent dinner. Overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B)

## DAY 11 Thursday, July 23: Vatican Museums, Sistine Chapel, and St. Peter's Basilica | Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls Farewell Dinner

After an early breakfast, transfer to St. Peter's Basilica to **celebrate Mass at the Tomb of St. Peter (subject to confirmation) or one of the Grotto Chapels.** After Mass, visit one of the great art collections in the world, the Vatican Museums. Walk in the footsteps of the Princes of the Church through the richly decorated galleries. Make our way through the Sistine Chapel and contemplate the frescoes of numerous Renaissance masters and the inspired ceiling of Michelangelo. End our morning tour in St. Peter's Basilica. Take in the awesome architecture and the statuary adorning this largest of all Christian churches, including Michelangelo's magnificent "Pietà." Pray at the tomb of St. John Paul II in St. Sebastian's Chapel. Independent lunch. Continue our day with a visit to the Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls, built by Constantine in the 4th century. St. Paul is buried in the confessor of this church. Above his tomb are the chains that were used to imprison him prior to his martyrdom. These chains were placed in this prominent location in 2008. The main altar in the left transept is dedicated to the Conversion of St. Paul. The painting above this altar, completed by Vincenzo Camuccini, depicts this event. The tabernacle of the confession by Arnolfo di Cambio, an exquisite 12th-century candelabra by Vassalletto, a 13th-century Byzantine-style apse mosaic of Christ Pantokrator, and an attractive 19th-century series of Papal portraits in a frieze extending around the nave. **Our festive farewell dinner this evening will be at Roman restaurant.** Experience an atmosphere of hospitality and friendship and taste the Mediterranean cuisine in a typical Roman setting with wine and music. Overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

## DAY 12 Friday, July 24: Return from Rome

Early morning, we'll be transferred to Rome's Leonardo Da Vinci Airport for our return flight home. Arrive on the same day. (B)

If a traveler does not travel on any one of the flights in the proper sequence, the rest of the reservation will be automatically canceled by the airline. Rebooking the canceled flight would be subject to a change fee and possible fare difference. If you purchase independent flights, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost(s) if you cancel participation for any reason. **It is important that you do not purchase airline tickets until the group has been confirmed for travel by PWT.**

**AIRLINE SEATING:** Under group contracts, seat selection is not permitted. Requests for seat preferences (window or aisle) may be made when you check in for the flight. There is no guarantee that requests will be honored. PWT cannot submit special seat requests on behalf of any passenger. Group reservations may not be accessed online for advance check-in/boarding passes/seat assignments. If seat selection is a condition that affects your decision to travel, it is suggested that you purchase the land only package in order to book your airline arrangements according to your specific needs.

**LAND ONLY PASSENGERS:** The Land Only package price is **\$4,895.00 per person sharing a twin room** (\$200 cash discount will be applied if all payments are made by check). The Land Only package does not include group airfare. It is the traveler's responsibility to book airline tickets independently. Any tour participant may change their status to "Land Only" by notifying PWT in writing, up to 100 days prior to departure. Passenger(s) opting for the Land Only package, or deviating from the group itinerary, are responsible for their own transfers to/from the hotel/airport. However, if your flights coordinate with the groups' arrangements, you are welcome to utilize the group transfer(s). **If you purchase your own airline transportation and the group does not materialize or you cancel for any reason, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost of your airfare.**

**DEVIATIONS & ITINERARY CHANGES:** PWT is pleased to assist clients with special requests. Deviation requests must be submitted in writing at least 100 days prior to departure. A deviation fee of \$150 plus any increase in airfare or additional fees may also apply. Not all carriers permit routing changes and/or deviations from the group itinerary. Please contact PWT for more information.

**TRANSFERS AND PORTERAGE:** Overseas round-trip airport transfers are included for passengers who purchase the full air and land package for the group tour dates. Portage of one piece of luggage at hotels throughout your tour is included. Peter's Way Tours cannot be held liable for any misplaced or lost luggage. It is the passenger's responsibility to make sure their luggage travels with them the entirety of the trip.

**ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS:** The package price is based on double occupancy (two twin beds). Married couples may request a double bed which is subject to availability. Triple rooms (two twin beds plus rollaway) may be requested, with no discount for triple occupancy. Single rooms may be requested at time of booking. Single rooms are limited, subject to confirmation, may be smaller, and located apart from the room block. **If a single room is confirmed, an additional charge of \$1,695.00 will apply.** We cannot guarantee roommate requests but will make every effort to pair you with another traveler, if double occupancy is requested. If a single room must be assigned due to lack of a traveler to pair you with, a roommate's cancellation, incompatibility, or any other reason (at the last moment or while on tour), you will be charged the single supplement.

**MEALS:** Breakfast daily plus eight (8) dinners, including a farewell dinner at a Roman restaurant.

**GRATUITIES & SERVICE CHARGES:** Gratuities are not included in your tour package. Although voluntary, for good work we recommend \$8.00 per person per day for your tour manager; \$5.00 per person per day for your bus driver; and \$2.00 per tour for

local guides. Tips for your tour manager and bus driver are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the package price. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave \$1.00 per person for the wait staff after each meal and \$1.00 per person per day for housekeeping. **(For tips, USD is accepted however local currency is preferred).**

**TRAVELER HEALTH ADVISORY:** Passengers must be medically and physically fit for travel and ensure that such traveling will not endanger themselves or others. PWT offers an optional Passenger Travel Protection Plan. These benefits and services help ensure the well-being of the passenger while traveling worldwide.
