Memorial Day

The celebration of this day, often believed to be associated with the Civil War, has ancient roots in communities wishing to honor the fallen, particularly those who had died during active service in the military. Various communities around the country had already established a set day and practice for decorating the graves of fallen veterans with either flags or flowers, sometimes with very elaborate ceremonies to accompany the acknowledgment of the fallen. Shortly after the Civil War, it became a more standard practice and common dates around the country began to emerge. Early on, it was referred to as Decoration Day in many communities.

Today, we celebrate Memorial Day on the last Monday of May. It serves as the (un)official beginning of the summer (vacation) season. While we see some acknowledgment of our fallen in parades around this time, less attention seems to be given to the 'decoration' of the memorials to our fallen. This year may be a good year to give some acknowledgment to our fallen at the various cemeteries and memorials in our communities, falling, as it does, within the Easter season, it may be worthwhile to pray for all the dead and for their place in the communion of saints.

The following is an appropriate prayer that may be used or adapted to the circumstances:

> God, our creator and redeemer, By your power Christ conquered death And returned to you in glory.

May all your people who have gone before us in faith Share his victory

And enjoy the vision of your glory forever, Where Christ lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, One God, forever and ever. Amen.


