#### Discussion Items

- o St. Anthony in the Hills Update
  - Anthony A. & Anthony F. provided an update on the sale of the property.
  - A formal announcement of the sale will be presented to the parish & the establishment of an endowment fund, to be named the Fr. Roberto Balducelli, OSFS, St. Anthony's Second Century Endowment Fund.
  - The property was purchased by New Garden Township and will be maintained as open space and dedicated to public use.

#### Parish Financial Update

- Bob Shields provided a written report, which was distributed to the Council members. He
  reviewed some high level conclusions from the report & answered questions.
- Some key facilities items to be addressed include the rectory roof (price TBD), repairs to the church roof (tile replacement, etc.), as well as repair to Scout Hall (roof and internal repairs).
- o Grade School tuition will increase approximately 4.5% for the 2019-2020 academic year.
- The Finance Council budget planning subcommittee continues to examine all parish budgets and expenses to examine potential cost savings.

#### Pastor's Discussion

 Fr. Mark discussed Cindy Mann's decision to retire at the end of this academic year. Fr. Mark also shared Cindy's letter outlining her decision. Fr. also shared that he will be consulting with the Diocesan Superintendent of Catholic Schools, as well as the Oblate Provincial, regarding next steps.

**Business Manager's Report to the Parish Council** 

### **Combined Parish Operations**

December 31, 2018 marked the half-way point for the 2018-2019 fiscal year.

Overall revenue has increased 1.9% from the same period during 2017

Overall expenses have decreased 1.7% from the same period during 2017

Net Income increased by 4.2% from the same period during 2017

## Parish Capital Needs

Replacement of the rectory roof is being discussed at the Parish Facilities Committee meeting this Thursday.

A request has been submitted to the Fusco Foundation for support to replace the broken tiles on the church roof. We have 325 tiles on site to begin this project.

The school has had boiler repairs in the past 30 days but no other capital expenditures are required at the moment.

#### Grade School

Tuition increase for the 2019-2020 school year is 4.5%.

A subcommittee of the Parish Finance Council along with the management staff of the grade school is closely reviewing the 2019-2020 proposed budget for expense adjustments and to develop additional revenue sources.

Dear Parents, Students, Alumnae Friends of Padua Academy,

These women, not only current students, but our very strong and successful alumnae as well as all of the young girls yet to attend, are everyone's hope of the future.

Over the past ten years, it has been my sincere joy to create a team of gifted educational leaders who, in concert with our students, alumnae, and Padua's Board of Trustees have recreated Padua Academy into the school it is today - a premiere twenty- first century women's secondary school. Our Vision and Mission have animated our innovative curriculum within our unique school environment, embracing intellectual curiosity, self-empowerment, gratitude and faith. This has propelled us into a worldwide view of science, technology, mathematics, journalism, communication and the historic point of view that helps to inform the future of our world community.
